a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

Gulf County will implement construction methods that emphasize quality, durability, efficiency, and sustainability. This project will also be designed to incorporate principles of resilience and mitigation against the impact of future disasters. This project is designed to help mitigate the increasing threat of coastal flooding due to weather events by providing additional evacuation opportunities to residents from future severe tropical weather events. It will also serve as a staging area for post-disaster recovery operations, including air-lifts of critical supplies and arrival of first responders. With the anticipation and understanding of future coastal flooding hazards, new transportation and airport infrastructure will increase evacuation opportunities for residents of Gulf County and will enhance emergency response capabilities in the aftermath of a natural disaster.



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b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

This project will create an airport that will allow for tremendous opportunities in community and economic development. This project can also serve as a hub for evacuation of residents from future severe tropical weather events, and it will serve as a staging area for post-disaster recovery operations, including air-lifts of critical supplies and arrival of first responders. The project will provide the general public with the benefit of accessible aviation, which is especially rare in this region of Florida.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

A functioning airport that Gulf County does not currently have.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Approximately 14,606 residents of Gulf County as well as visitors that travel to Gulf County.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

New transportation and airport infrastructure will increase evacuation opportunities for residents of Gulf County and will enhance emergency response capabilities in the aftermath of a natural disaster. It will also serve as a staging area for post-disaster recovery operations, including air-lifts of critical supplies and arrival of first responders as well as provide an alternative travel opportunity for residents and visitors to the area. Recording the number of flights to and from Gulf County would determine the impact.
