4. Project/Program Description

In 2018, Hurricane Michael destroyed a significant portion of the water delivery infrastructure for Lighthouse Utilities water system, a private enterprise serving much of the southern portion of Gulf County near the coast. Because of the extent of the damage, Gulf County purchased the utility in order to rehabilitate the system and seek a more suitable location for its wells and other infrastructure. The search for and development of a more inland source of water is supported and partially funded by the Northwest Florida Water Management District. This project will supplement existing funds for the continued construction of the Gulf County Water System in a more inland location. An inland location will help ensure the protection of the Gulf County Water System and a continuity of service to its residents and visitors should Gulf County experience natural disasters (i.e. hurricanes, storm surge) in the future.

The water system will provide a safe drinking water source for the County's residents and visitors that will be more resilient during disasters.

Approximately 16,323 residents of Gulf County as well as visitors that travel to Gulf County.

Storm vulnerability analyses were conducted after the devastating impacts of Hurricane Michael left significant portions of the county's residents without a reliable source of water. The analyses call for the securing of the county's drinking water source, and the Northwest Florida Water Management District conducted inland well performance studies and paid for the construction of a production well to help identify and secure a more reliable source than that which was destroyed at the coast. A relocated water system to be more inland will protect it from natural disasters, such as hurricanes and storm surges. Moving away from the coastline will also protect it from saltwater intrusion. An inland water system will make it more resilient to hurricanes and storm surges. Safe and reliable water is a must for any community, especially during disasters.
