a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

Safety and program enrichment through activities and events for students and adults in the state of Florida. Otherwise these students and adults would have to go to the overcrowded state parks.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?



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Lifesaving and water safety instruction to children and adults. Youth achieving Aquatic Merit Badges for a lifelong skill of saving their own life and the lives of other Floridians.

Gathering in the Dining Hall for three meals per day plus programing at other times during the day in a dry and clean area that there is not water dripping down on the floor causing a slip and fall issue and damaging other materials in the building. In addition, the dinning hall serves as the primary safe haven location for inclement weather.

New Pavilion will allow for major programing activities at the Adventure Camp. In addition, this pavilion will provide a safe area for inclement weather for the students and Scouts participating in the daily high ropes adventures.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Scouting America prepares young people in Florida to make ethical and moral choices over their lifetimes by instilling in them the values of the Scout Oath and Law.

Our programs put on at Camp La-No-Che located in the Leonard and Marjorie Williams Family Scout Reservation serve youth in elementary, middle and high schools throughout numerous counties in the State of Florida and is open to all counties in Florida. Many non-scouting groups utilize our facilities annually such as; Public schools and 6 JROTC groups (over 2,500 youth) from around the state.
