13. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

Now in yr 4 of 5 originally approved, the Institute provides a statewide P.D. Program for K-12 classical teachers. Leveraging the learning resources of Flagler, it provides seminars, workshops, & courses for K-12 Classical school teachers. The institute is doubling the number of teachers served each year in our summer conference and has partnered with the FLDOE to develop classical teacher certification modules. The funds requested will serve the explosive growth in demand for these services.



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b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Full-time faculty trained in the classical model of education. K12 Classical teachers statewide receive professional development through summer trainings, workshops, and Saturday seminars. K-12 classical summer camps for scholars and public lectures.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Full-time faculty teaching First Year Seminar course students. The development of a higher ed retention model based on the classical model of education. Workshops, conferences, public lectures, and guest scholars for K-12 teachers statewide. In partnership with the FLDOE, the creation and delivery of classical teacher certification courses.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Florida K-12 Classical teachers and administrators, College students, K-12 Students. More than 1,000 individuals will be directly served using these funds, and thousands of K-12 classical students statewide will be indirectly served through professional development for their teachers - thus enhancing their educational experience.

Enriched Cultural Experience through lectures and trainings, Improved Quality of Education through professional development for K12 teachers and increased economic activity through new jobs created and increased teacher retention rates.
