13. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

To provide training, a facility with significant open floor space, 16' or higher ceilings, adequate power, and a ventilation/exhaust system is required. SJR State does not have a facility of this type on any of its campuses. As a result, the college has been unable to offer instructional programs in building trades, a high demand trade for the service areas. In addition, the college will be launching a new maritime academy to prepare individuals for this growing industry in northeast Florida.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?



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Provide instructional space for maritime and building trades to support workforce needs in the College's service district. Funding this capital improvement project will allow the College to develop comprehensive career and technical education programming to meet workforce needs in Putnam County.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

As the construction and marine industries are growing robustly in the College's service district and there is currently no facility at the College's three campuses configured to facilitate instruction in these fields, this project will allow the College to create and confer new degrees and certificates to graduates who will immediately fill positions needed by local and regional employers.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The target population for this project are jobless and economically disadvantaged persons and college students. The project expects to generate over 75,000 student credit hours and serve approximately 2,100 individuals across the lifetime of the building.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will

be measured?

The project will improve the quality of education for individuals in the region by preparing graduates for jobs in construction and maritime targeted industries. The project will support an increase in the number of construction and maritime jobs, and will create specific job opportunities for those employed by the College to teach in these programs. Success would be measured by surveying those who employ program graduates, post-completion employment data in the construction and maritime sectors in the service district, as well as wage data for those employed.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for in the contract?

\$1,000 per day in liquidated damages for failure to meet substantial completion.
