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The city currently has more than 90 miles of roads ranging in methods of construction from early 1900s brick, dirt, and asphalt over brick. Potholes, Pavement edge cracking, alligator cracking, and rutting due to inadequate substructure are evident throughout the city. The city is requesting funding in the amount of \$3.3 million to begin the reconstruction and resurfacing in order to get the streets in a condition where annual maintenance would be sufficient to ensure the safety of

t	the city's roadways.

F	The project area is city wide and would address construction of streets currently dirt, reconstruction or resurfacing failing paved asphalt and or brick, and rectifying the underlying infrastructure issues. The repair and resurfacing of the city roadways would provide citizens safer driving, walking, and cycling conditions.
