	The ROVETTA BUILDING A (RBA) and ROVETTA BUILDING B (RBB) are essential to FSU's academic operations, housing departments like Accounting, Finance, Marketing, and Economics, among others. However, both buildings are aging and in need of renovation. RBA, built in 1983, covers 67,518 square feet, while RBB, constructed in 1957, spans 74,705 square feet. These buildings are integral to the College of Business, which is being relocated to new construction. Given their deteriorating conditions, the requested appropriations aim to address the critical need for renovations to ensure these spaces remain functional and conducive to academic excellence for the departments still housed within them.

The funds requested will be used to renovate Rovetta Building A and B, with the goal of improving the quality of education at FSU. The renovations will create modern, accessible classrooms, offices, and common areas that support teaching and learning.
