This parcel will accommodate the needs of the Substation and Marine Unit to include offices, training room, reception office area, restroom, kitchenette, workshop for diving gear, storage for trailered boats, fencing for security, boat ramp and a boat house with a lift. The total approximate square footage required to meet these needs would be about 6,000 square feet.

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b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The current substation is located in a small building from 1980. It has little storage or workshop space and does not have direct water access. Having their marine unit located on land that is conducive to immediate water access within our intracoastal waterway will allow law enforcement to provide life-saving measures quickly and effectively.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Relocate the Sheriff's Substation to county-owned land with direct water access to the intracoastal waterway. This parcel will accommodate the needs of the Substation and Marine Unit to include approximately 6,000 square feet for offices, training room, reception office area, workshop for diving gear, storage for trailered boats, fencing for security, boat ramp and a boat house with a lift.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The majority of funds will benefit no specific group within the county but the total population for Flagler County is more than 130k. Since this new facility will be located on the Barrier Island it will have a specific benefit to the residents in that area. However the Marine Unit having direct water access to improve response time to emergent situations benefits the entire community.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

It will improve efficiencies for response in an underserved portion of the county and with direct water access, it will allow the Marine Unit to respond quickly and be more effective in water rescue and emergency situations. Additionally, monitoring speed/manatee zones and driving conditions will provide a safer boating environment and keep manatee's safe from harm. Methodology used will include the statistics on boating accidents in Florida, participation in safe boating classes and number of manatee's killed as a result of speed.
