### 13. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

Construction of a Regional Trails & Conservation Center which will provide diverse educational resources and hands-on experiences, emphasizing the importance of natural resource conservation. It will be located within a significant greenway and will serve as the gateway to the area that includes Graham Swamp Preserve, Bulow Creek and Tomoka Marsh. A recent Parks Master Plan revealed a strong need and desire from residents for enhanced recreational amenities, services, and access.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Construction of a 10,000 sq. ft. building that will be situated in an ecologically significant part of the county, and will offer interactive exhibits, guided tours, recreational services (biking, hiking, birding, kayaking, wildlife viewing) and various revenue streams. This will be located on county owned land and act as the State Road 100 Trail head for two significant trail systems.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The Center will be the main hub for regional ecotourism information and provide experiences for recreational and educational opportunities. The facility will have community space for rental opportunities to help make the center self-sustaining. Connectivity and access to future Bulow Creek Regional Park, the new pedestrian bridge, and the existing Lehigh Trail System will promote conservation.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

All county residents (130K) plus tourists visiting the area. There are currently millions of tourists that come to the Sunshine State each year. The new Regional Trails & Conservation Center will be 30 minutes from Daytona and St. Augustine. These two cities combined host well over 17 million tourists each year. Since the Center will be located right off I-95, they could tap into the millions of tourists already coming to the area.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The center will improve the physical health of the public through offering various experiences including hiking, biking and kayaking. This would be measured through the number of people coming to the center and requesting information on these activities. It will also improve transportation conditions into Flagler Beach through offering a shuttle service from the center to the beach area. This will be measured through the number of riders. It will increase economic activity and tourism for Flagler County and local businesses through supporting and advertising of the local businesses at the center. This will be measured by the number of tourists visiting with hotel stays and the number of businesses indicating increased traffic and sales as a result of the promotion. Finally the Center will improve local trails and wildlife quality by connecting to a 1,000-acre regional park. Visitors will indicate learning critical knowledge about the environment and conservation.
