a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

To reduce standing water in this area and water intrusion into properties on this street. This project will help contain stormwater runoff minimizing outfall discharge directly into the C-8 canal which flows into the Biscayne Bay aquifer.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Our precise objective is to ensure that stormwater runoff is captured as NE 104 Street runs perpendicular to Biscayne Bay and the runoff would not be contaminated with environmental hazards such as oils, chemicals and other hazardous materials. Currently, the stormwater runoff goes into outfalls that discharge directly into the C-8 canal and moves into the Biscayne Bay aquifer.

floodwaters to get to their home. Additionally, some of the homes on this street are experiencing septic system failures due to the excessive moisture in the soil. d.
