The 2nd Ave N roadway corridor is occupied by commercial and residential property, and is located within the Village's Community Redevelopment Area. The project has been identified in the Village's Stormwater Master Plan. The construction plans are complete and construction is expected to commence in early 2025.

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The proposed stormwater system is comprised of new drainage piping, structures and swales to catch and pre-treat stormwater runoff. The associated improvements will reduce flooding in the area and provide for water quality pre-treatment.

**c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?**

The project will drastically reduce private property flooding and minimize damage and liability caused by severe weather events. The roadway right of way will also be enhanced through these improvements reducing roadway flooding and channeling runoff appropriately.

**d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?**

The project serves primarily the residential and commercial corridor along 2nd Ave North, and portions of Davis Road, Miller Road and Reidel Avenue. There are 29 commercial properties and 202 residential properties within the project area (197 single family homes and 5 rental properties with 41 units), with an estimated population of 600 residents.

**e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?**

The primary benefit is the drastic reduction in flooding to the 2nd Ave North roadway and surrounding commercial and residential properties, located within Palm Springs' Community Redevelopment Area, to facilitate redevelopment, attraction of new and expansion of existing businesses. Outcomes may be demonstrated through number of new jobs created, and/or dollars spent on redevelopment/renovation of properties benefited by the drastic reduction in flooding events.
