The Tarpon Dock Bridge is one of the few remaining draw bridges remaining in the State. This bridge is necessary to maintain not only residential traffic, but also first responder access and egress to a historic neighborhood. Additionally, the United States Coast Guard requires we maintain access to the body of water the bridge crosses. This project consists of replacement of a subaqueous water main and bridge refurbishment activities.

Performing the subaqueous water main replacement will better protect the water main from vessels witch currently travel over the water main that rests on the sea bed. Additionally, the bridge refurbishment will allow for continued and more reliable access to a large historic neighborhood for emergency first responders. Measurable: Survey of residents. Number of bridge closures due to mechanical/thermal interruptions.
