a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?



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Provide new classrooms to implement the following vocational educational programs to 500 students at Cottondale High School: JROTC, Business, and Agriculture. The district is exploring Solar Field Technician as a possible addition. These vocational programs will provide services to 120-240 students each school year through high-quality instruction leading to industry certifications. New multi-purpose building to serve the community for events like parent trainings, staff trainings, and social events for the school that has no auditorium.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Provide new vocational education classrooms and new multi-purpose facility students, parents, and the community of approximately 3000 benefactors. Provide access to the community to hold training events and community events.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Provide educational classrooms to benefit the community through Career and Technical Education courses leading to Industry Certifications. Provide access to student, their parents, and the community access to a multi-purpose room for community events. Annual number of citizens benefiting from the project is 3,000.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The primary target populations of the project are the students, staff, and parents of Cottondale High School. This is about 1500 individuals. Indirect target populations are the community of Cottondale, Cottondale Elementary School's students, parents, and staff. Indirect benefactors are another 1500 individuals.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Provide students access to a multi-purpose building for 50-75 years for Industry Certifications. Improve access to highquality education that is career themed. Measured by annual industry certification results as applied in middle school and high school acceleration components of the school grade.

Decrease allocation by 2%.
