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The goal of NextStep at Endeavor Academy is to build an inclusive community where the benefits of educating and employing individuals with autism are broadly understood. Adults with autism spectrum disorders (ASD) will receive curriculum, services, and supports needed to complete intensive learning experiences to increase their ability to maintain competitive employment and live independently. NextStep's short courses also provide coaching and instruction for the neurodivergent population.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Direct instruction in Learn4Independence® coursework, applied learning in job settings (volunteer, paid and unpaid internships, competitive employment, and self-employment), direct instruction in independent living skills, and applied learning in the community and through the residential component of NextStep Academy; direct instruction in social competencies offered across all settings.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Direct instruction in both classroom and natural (applied) settings; job coaching; help with identifying and accessing natural supports at work and in the community; assessment; targeted goals (employment, social, communication, independent living); maintenance of goals; follow-up checks to measure long-term progress after completing the program.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The target population served by this project will include adults with autism who have aged out of the K-12 educational system but still need support for success. These individuals may be jobless, economically disadvantaged, developmentally disabled, and/or college students. The project will serve between 51-100 individuals.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Participants enrolled in NextStep's Transition Academy will complete the Learn4Independence® coursework (a 32-course curriculum focusing on employment/life skills). Lessons include the areas of work, finances, safety, relationships, nutrition, community, health, problem-solving, transportation, and living independently. Participants enrolled in NextStep's Transition Academy will receive experience and support in an employment setting. Outcomes will be measured through participant mastery of the coursework modules and individualized goals related to employment and living independently.
