4. Project/Program Description

The Hernando County Sheriff's Office Animal Shelter faces challenges that limit its ability to effectively serve both the animals and the community. This proposal seeks to enhance the facility by addressing critical infrastructure issues, expanding space, and upgrading key areas to create a safe, comfortable environment for animals in its care. Some key improvements include renovating the dog kennels and cat rooms; a new adoption center for meet-and-greets and adoption processing; a dedicated grooming area to ensure proper hygiene and care; expanding intake, quarantine, and storage space; and adding a vet clinic and pet food pantry for low-income families. These upgrades will enhance animal welfare, encourage responsible pet ownership, and promote healthier pets, leading to stronger community engagement and benefit public health.

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?



This proposal aims to create a safe, comfortable, and efficient environment for all animals in the shelter's care by addressing critical infrastructure challenges and enhance its capacity to serve both the animals and the public. We also seek to educate and support the community by making veterinary services and adoption more accessible, while promoting responsible pet ownership and reducing pet abandonment. Ultimately, the goal is to modernize and improve the shelter, so it can better serve both the animals and the community, ensuring long term benefits for animal welfare and public health.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Our goal is to renovate and upgrade key infrastructure, including dog kennels, drainage, ventilation, pole barn, and cat rooms. We plan to add a new adoption center to better accommodate meet-and-greets and adoption processing, along with a dedicated grooming area to ensure proper hygiene and care. We will also increase space for intakes, quarantine, and storage, a veterinary clinic and pet food pantry for low-income individuals/families, and implement a Trap-Neuter-Vaccinate-Return (TNVR) program for stray cats in the community.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The new adoption center will enhance meet-and-greet sessions and streamline the adoption process, improving the overall experience for the public and reducing pet returns. The addition of a veterinary clinic and pet food pantry will support low-income pet owners who may not otherwise have access to essential veterinary care, promoting responsible pet ownership and reducing pet abandonment. Implementing a Trap-Neuter-Vaccinate-Return (TNVR) program will help reduce the stray animal population, promoting healthier, more sustainable communities.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The target population includes the animals as well as the staff and volunteers at the animal shelter, along with the 218,000 residents of Hernando County.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Improved well being of the animals, measured by observations or feedback from staff and volunteers. Higher adoption rates, measured by shelter data. Less adoption returns, measured by shelter data. Increased public engagement, measured by increased adoption rates, pet retention rates, and customer satisfaction surveys. Increased workplace engagement, performance, and mental well being for the employees and volunteers, measured by surveys and feedback.
