The Florida Senate Local Funding Initiative Request Fiscal Year 2025-2026

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The goal is to empower Citrus County students with the knowledge and skills needed for high-skilled, high-demand health related careers by expanding current health academy pathways at Crystal River High School. The students will learn technical health focused skills, related hands on training, and master the knowledge needed to be successful and earn industry certification in health related fields. Students will be ready for direct employment or advanced training at any post secondary school within the Florida College System.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The Crystal River High School Health Academy will provide courses with challenging standards, hands on training, relevant technical knowledge, and skills needed to earn industry certification for direct employment in a health related field or advanced training at a post secondary school to build the students' careers in various health pathways.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The direct services will be four years of high school courses to prepare our students to be employable directly out of high school or to continue to advanced training at a postsecondary facility. This will fill the skilled medical trade gap in our area, promote economic growth, and establish a high standard of living for the residents of Citrus County.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The targeted population will be students from across the county who are interested in developing skills needed for medically associated careers. We currently have 225 students enrolled annually in the Health Academy at Crystal River High School.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The expected outcome is to increase industry certifications earned, graduation rates, and essential jobs filled for community growth. This project will also decrease the high school dropout rate increasing the number of students entering the workforce with high-skilled, high-wage jobs. These data points will be gathered and compared to the previous year's data.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for in the contract?

Citrus County Schools is committed to addressing Florida's Health Trade shortage through innovative training. In the event that performance measures are not met, we will ask for a 60 day performance improvement plan.
