#### 13. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

Requested funds will replace and expand Bridges #874311 and #874313, located on SW 152nd Avenue over the C-103 Canal in downtown Homestead, a heavily traveled major collector roadway. Built in 1987 and deemed structurally deficient during a 2024 FDOT inspection, the bridges require significant repairs. Replacement will add a travel lane, sidewalks, and bicycle lanes, addressing traffic demands and providing safe passage for pedestrians and cyclists, while ensuring lasting structural integrity.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?



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Funds will support bridge design, demolition, and construction to replace and expand the structurally deficient bridges. Activities include adding an additional travel lane, sidewalks, and bike lanes, improving roadways, enhancing drainage, ensuring safety compliance, and conducting public outreach. Upgrades will enhance safety, reduce congestion, improve mobility, and support economic growth.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The funding will provide safer, more efficient transportation by replacing and expanding the bridges to include an additional travel lane, sidewalks, and bike lanes. Citizens will benefit from improved traffic flow, reduced congestion, enhanced pedestrian and cyclist safety, and better access to businesses and services. Upgrades will ensure structural integrity, economic growth, and mobility.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The general public, including motorists, cyclists, and pedestrians, will benefit, impacting thousands who rely on this major corridor for daily travel.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The project will improve transportation efficiency, reduce accidents, and enhance multimodal accessibility. Success will be measured through traffic flow analysis, accident rate monitoring, and user feedback.
