#### 13. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?



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The Marina is a keystone to the community used by residents, business, and visitors alike, it is a hub of activity for events, surrounding businesses, parkland, recreational and commercial fishing and activities. It is estimated neighboring businesses will experience over \$1M in loss revenue, residents displaced, lack of emergency support by the Fire and Sheriff boats. Restoring use will support business, restore tourism via day and ferry boat use, and support commercial and recreational use.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Activities associated with these funds are all focused on marina structural repair and replacement and equipment repair and replacement. Based on an engineering study, estimated repair and replacement is approx \$18M. Funds will be used to replace damaged bulkhead wall, replace day docks and public fishing pier, including emergency vessel docks (Fire & Sheriff) and transportation services (Clearwater Ferry), repairing piers/docks and slips, repairing/replacement of fire suppression system and electrical system.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Restoration of marina returns activity to this central hub - including events, transportation services, emergency services (fire boat and Sheriff's boat), supports tourism and economic development via day dock usage, boat ramp usage and commercial vessel usage. In addition surrounding businesses have been impacted by the closure and lack of activity. Residents have been unable to access vessels and partake in any recreational activity. The marina creates a large tourism and resident use via the fishing piers, sunsets, and kayak and small boat sailing activity (youth sailing), all of which haven't occurred since the storms.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Directly, Dunedin Residents of approximately 36,000 and indirectly, Pinellas County Residents and Vistors, which is over 1 million.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The outcome impacts many areas - tourism: restoring visitors to marina as a focal point of the community, events like Piper on the Pier and watching sunsets, and restoring transportation services (Clearwater Ferry) measured in visitor counts and transport usage; economic development: supporting local businesses in the surrounding areas that have been impacted and suffering measured in business revenue; recreation for day dock users, slip renters, boat ramp users, kayak and youth small boat sailing measured in user counts; commercial fishing and tourism vessel measured in business revenue and guest counts; safety and security of returning fire boat and Sheriff boat measured by calls and dispatched services, incidents reported.
