a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

Funds will facilitate the construction of a YMCA facility within Lake Meade Park in Cape Coral, FL. The facility will provide public-use recreational facilities and community-based services. This initiative aims to enhance community engagement, promote health and wellness, and expand access to recreational and social programs.



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b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The YMCA facility at Lake Meade Park will offer fitness programs, youth sports, aquatics, wellness initiatives, childcare, after-school programs, and senior activities. It will also serve as a hub for health, education, and social services, promoting community engagement and well-being.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The funding will support fitness programs, youth sports, aquatics, wellness initiatives, childcare, after-school programs, and senior activities at the YMCA facility in Lake Meade Park. Citizens will have access to recreational facilities, health education, and social services, fostering physical well-being, youth development, and community engagement in a safe and inclusive environment.
