### 13. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?



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The requested funds will support the renovation and transformation of the historic Speer Center in Arcadia, FL, into a multipurpose YMCA program center. This project will primarily provide high-quality childcare services while also offering youth and adult programs based on community needs. Funding will cover renovation, construction, and FF&E, ensuring a safe, modern, and functional space that enhances accessibility and strengthens community services.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The renovated Speer Center will provide high-quality childcare, afterschool programs, youth development initiatives, and adult education classes. Additional services will include health and wellness programs, workforce training, and community engagement activities, ensuring a multi-use space that meets the diverse needs of Arcadia residents.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The funding will support direct services including affordable childcare, early learning programs, afterschool care, and youth enrichment activities. Additionally, the center will offer adult education, job training, wellness programs, and community events, providing a safe and accessible space that enhances opportunities for Arcadia residents of all ages.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The target population includes economically disadvantaged individuals, at-risk youth, jobless persons, preschool and school-age students, and the general community in Arcadia. The project is expected to serve 800+ individuals, providing essential childcare, education, workforce training, and wellness programs.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The project will enhance economic self-sufficiency through childcare and workforce training, create jobs, improve education, and promote physical health. Outcomes will be measured by enrollment, job placement, income growth, student progress, and health program participation.
