The Northeast Reservoir Water Transmission and Regional Water Supply Project is a vital regional initiative that will transfer up to 1.44 billion gallons of water annually from a reservoir in Charlotte County to Cape Coral's freshwater canal system. This water will be used for fire suppression and lawn irrigation. With construction-ready plans and a purchase agreement for the Charlotte County property in place, the project is poised for construction and implementation.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The water from the Reservoir will be use for fire suppression, to maintain canal levels in the dry season, and by property owners for lawn irrigation purposes.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project? The direct services provided to citizens through this project will include: Fire Suppression: The system will supply water to support fire suppression efforts, helping to protect homes, businesses, and public spaces in Cape Coral by ensuring an adequate and reliable water source during emergencies. Irrigation: The project will provide water for lawn irrigation, helping residents and businesses maintain landscaping and reduce reliance on potable water for non-drinking purposes. Increased Water Availability: By utilizing the abandoned mine to store excess surface water, this project will increase the availability of water for the community, contributing to long-term water sustainability. These services will directly benefit residents by ensuring adequate water supplies for both essential safety and everyday needs. d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served? The target population is all city residents, which is more than 220,000 people. e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured? The additional water resources will help alleviate pressure on the underlying Floridan Aquifer, promoting a more sustainable source of irrigation water for the Southwest Florida region. The benefit of this project will be measured by monitoring the stability of freshwater canal levels, especially during the dry season, to ensure more consistent water flow. Additionally, improvements in the Cecil Webb Wildlife Management Area and Yucca Pens (State property) will be assessed by tracking changes in water levels and the overall health of these environmentally sensitive areas. f.
