13. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

Funds will expand current clinical and community supports provided to individuals with Autism Spectrum Disorder and their families into 8 additional counties (Sarasota, Manatee, Pinellas, Pasco, Lee, Collier, Hendry & Glades). Funds will also launch the Military Special Needs program to provide much needed support to military families with autistic children at military bases. Our servicemen and women who have children with autism face numerous challenges with securing support, particularly when relocating to new locations. Family Initiative will support these families.

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b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Family Initiative's continuum of care currently provides early screenings and intervention, social skills groups for children from infancy to young adult, support groups for siblings, parents, and other caregivers, vocational training, workforce programs, clinical services including applied behavior analysis and occupational therapy and educational services. The services will be expanded into Sarasota, Manatee, Pinellas, Pasco, Lee, Collier, Hendry & Glades counties. Further, services such as early screenings and interventions, parent and caregiver training and support, clinical services, and access to the sensory trailer and kits will be provided to military families of children with autism.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The Family Initiative continuum of care will be expanded into Sarasota, Manatee, Pinellas, Pasco, Lee, Collier, Hendry & Glades counties. Direct services include early screenings and intervention, social skills groups for children from infancy to young adult, support groups for siblings, parents, and other caregivers, vocational training, workforce programs, clinical services including applied behavior analysis and occupational therapy services, and educational services. Direct services for the Military Special Needs program includes early screenings and intervention, parent and caregiver training and support, clinical services, and access to the sensory trailer and kits.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The population served by this funding will include families of children with autism and individuals with autism in the following counties: Sarasota, Manatee, Pinellas, Pasco, Lee, Collier, Hendry & Glades. Family Initiative served 2,400 families in 2024. We expect the funds to greatly increase the number of families we serve. Also, military families of children with autism will be served by this expanded program. According to the Florida Military Compact Council, in the 2017 school year, there were 39,686 school age children of military families. Based on CDC prevalence rates, this would mean in 2017, there were approximately 1,100 children with autism. While there is no current data, it is estimated close to 3,500 children with autism are children of military families in Florida. The funds will provide the potential for the Military Special Needs Program to reach all of these children.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The funding will benefit families with children with autism in the following counties: Sarasota, Manatee, Pinellas, Pasco, Lee, Collier, Hendry & Glades. The service will enable these children to live as independently as possible through community programs and clinical services. Military families with autistic children will have critical support and services to ensure their children can thrive. Studies show the early identification and intervention is critical to ensure optimal development for individuals with autism. Outcomes will be measured by number of families supported and each individual's progress realized, the resources provided, the ability to link families to necessary medical services.
