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The funds requested will be used to establish a mooring field shoreside facility that will replace harmful and unmanaged anchoring practices and align with Florida Statute 327.4108 and FWC goals and priorities. This includes providing essential services such as pumpout access, waste disposal, dinghy docks, and bathhouse facilities to ensure compliance with environmental regulations, protect sensitive marine habitats like seagrass beds, enhance water quality, and improve boater safety.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The requested funds will enable the construction of a robust, Category 5-rated shoreside facility designed to serve the needs of the mooring field and its users. This state-of-the-art facility will feature six unisex shower/bathrooms, a dockmaster's office, a maintenance room, and a dockmaster's apartment to ensure efficient operations and oversight. Additionally, the funds will support the construction of a dinghy access dock and the maintenance dredging of the existing channel, ensuring safe and reliable shoreside access for boaters.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The project will provide citizens with direct services essential for a safe, sustainable, and well-managed boating environment. These include: Shoreside Access: Secure access to the mooring field via a dinghy dock and a dredged channel. Waste Management: Vessel waste pumpout and proper waste disposal facilities to protect water quality. Bathhouse Facility: Six unisex shower/bathrooms to serve boaters and liveaboards. On-Site Management: A dockmaster's office and apartment for efficient facility operations, security, and oversight.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The funding will directly benefit recreational boaters and the liveaboard community. In the Keys, where affordable housing is limited, liveaboard vessels provide essential housing for many, including service sector workers, supporting both housing affordability and sustainable maritime living. This project will serve the entire boating community of the lower Florida Keys. There are greater than 26,500 vessels registered in Monroe County and over 73,600 vessels registered in neighboring Miami-Dade county.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The shoreside facility is essential to the new mooring field, ending harmful anchoring practices that damage seagrass beds and harm Monroe County's marine ecosystem. It ensures waste disposal, monitors vessels for compliance and dereliction, and promotes responsible boating. Secure moorings attract boaters, provide affordable housing for liveaboards, boost tourism, and preserve vital habitats. The facility also supports workforce retention, sustaining businesses and tourism while protecting the local economy.
