Replace the existing sanitary forcemain that crosses the Intracoastal Waterway, that is old failing forcemain that had four pipe breaks, and conveys all of the wastewater collected on Singer Island and the Town of Palm Beach Shores to the mainland. It is necessary to design the pipe replacement as failure of this pipeline would result in loss of service and environmental damage if sewage were to continue to be released into the pristine waterway. Also, replace the existing potable water main that crosses the Intracoastal Waterway that provides drinking water to Singer Island and the Town of Palm Beach Shores. It is necessary to design the pipe replacement as a failure of this water main, which was constructed in the 1950s, would result in loss of adequate service of drinking water and fire protection to citizens and businesses.

This enhances public health, safety, and essential infrastructure services for residents and businesses.
