a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

The requested funding aims to bridge the critical gap in services for transitioning service members as they navigate the challenging shift from military to civilian life. The program focuses on translating military skills, crafting personal narratives, setting career goals, mastering interviews, and building a professional image. Participants will also receive personalized resume assistance and professional attire, ensuring they are prepared to confidently embark on their next chapter.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?



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Program participants will engage in comprehensive Life Skills and Employment Skills Training sessions. Upon completion of the training, they will participate in individualized one-on-one sessions, which include tailored resume development, personalized image consulting, and professional suiting services to ensure they are fully prepared for workforce integration.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The direct services will include comprehensive training on translating military skills into civilian applications, crafting a compelling personal narrative, mastering complex interview techniques, and cultivating a professional image. Additionally, program participants will benefit from personalized resume assistance and the provision of professional attire, ensuring they are fully equipped.

This project aims to support Veterans, transitioning military service members, and their families, with a goal of serving 300 individuals.
