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13. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

Through state funding, the Holocaust Memorial supports the teaching of the history of the Holocaust and its lessons through personal testimonies of survivors. The primary purpose of the project is to improve student achievement by providing learning opportunities to students, teachers, and community members. Specifically, the Holocaust Memorial provides resources and educational opportunities that align with state-mandated instruction on the Holocaust according to Florida Statutes 1003.42(2)(9).

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The Holocaust Memorial will provide educational programs, resources, materials, lesson plans, professional development opportunities for Florida educators and students in grades 5-12, college/university, and the general public that aligns with section 1003.42(2)(g), Florida Statues, and Florida's state academic standards.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Docent-led tours of the Holocaust Memorial and Education Center, Holocaust survivor and their descendants testimony, educational resources and materials, Holocaust teacher training, volunteer training, student advocacy program, Holocaust Education Week, community-wide programs and events (film screenings, lectures, scholar and book talks, Kristallnacht and Holocaust Remembrance Day ceremonies).

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Florida public elementary and secondary schools, including university research developmental schools, instructional staff and other educators, and the citizens of the state of Florida. The Holocaust Memorial Miami Beach serves 100,000 students and visitors annually.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

This project will improve quality of education by increasing student knowledge of the Holocaust and antisemitism aligned to Florida's state standards. We aim to double the number of students who visit the Holocaust Memorial and double the number of teachers trained to teach about the Holocaust. We aim to foster greater awareness and understanding of intolerance, antisemitism, and racism. Through education programs and teacher training, it helps prevent the spread of hate and prejudice, reducing social tensions and promoting a more inclusive society. By addressing these issues proactively, the Holocaust Memorial contributes to creating a safer and more harmonious community for all. We will conduct pre-visit and post-visit surveys with educators and students to track number of student visitors to the Holocaust Memorial and track number of teachers engaged and trained. Surveys will assess changes in knowledge, attitudes, and awareness regarding intolerance, antisemitism, and racism.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for in the contract?

Financial withholdings or reductions in future funding allocations, mandatory corrective action plans with specific deadlines, increased reporting and oversight requirements, or temporary suspension of funding until deliverables are met.
