This facility will serve as a multi-purpose hub for police personnel, providing a secure parking structure for law enforcement vehicles, dedicated training areas, and an emergency staging zone for rapid deployment during critical incidents. By integrating essential resources into one strategic location, this facility will enhance operational efficiency, readiness, and response times for public safety efforts.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

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To provide secure parking spaces for law enforcement vehicles, including patrol cars, emergency response units, and specialized vehicles. To create dedicated emergency staging areas that facilitate quick mobilization of law enforcement and emergency vehicles in response to critical incidents. To establish training zones and readiness spaces within the garage to enhance officers' tactical skills, crisis management, and vehicle operations. To contribute to overall public safety by enhancing the law enforcement infrastructure necessary to protect and serve the community.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Citizens will experience faster, more coordinated emergency responses in situations such as natural disasters, public safety threats, and major accidents. The facility's emergency staging area ensures law enforcement and emergency vehicles are readily available and quickly deployed, minimizing delays during critical moments. The presence of a stateof-the-art facility dedicated to readiness ensures that citizens can rely on swift, organized, and efficient emergency response, strengthening the community's resilience and safety during emergencies.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The facility will serve hundreds of law enforcement officers, providing them with a dedicated, centralized space for vehicle staging, training, and operational readiness. This will enhance the efficiency, effectiveness, and safety of officers across the region. Additional emergency response units (such as fire departments, EMS, and specialized tactical teams) who may need to coordinate with law enforcement for large-scale events or disasters. The entire community benefits from quicker emergency response times, improved public safety, and a more trained and prepared law enforcement presence. The facility indirectly serves thousands of citizens, particularly in emergencies, ensuring public safety is maintained during critical events or incidents.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Faster deployment of law enforcement and emergency vehicles during critical incidents, reducing response times in emergencies. Law enforcement vehicles will be securely stored, regularly maintained, and mission-ready at all times. Improved law enforcement coordination during major incidents (natural disasters, active shooter situations, civil unrest, etc.). Measurement Methodology: Track multi-agency coordination drills and readiness exercises. Measure deployment efficiency in real emergency situations. Document after-action reports to evaluate response effectiveness.
