4. Project/Program Description

Through an unprecedented public-private Moonshot partnership, The Learning Alliance and the SDIRC are building a hub of teaching excellence K-3rd grade. We have moved from 31st to 12th in state rankings for third grade reading by embedding an 17-person K-3rd grade coaching accelerator team across 13 schools coupled with a 7-person literacy accelerator team deep within our best practice, title one, high needs demonstration school. Our 90% community Moonshot goal has enabled us to partner these private resources with state-of-the-art systems change model, to build a hub and spoke institute for teaching and learning excellence.

13. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

This high-needs, Title I, public school of choice will attract families seeking best-practice literacy instruction grounded in the Science of Reading. Funds will augment our teacher coaching Acceleration Team, whose purpose is to attract and grow a talent bench of educators with expertise in literacy and best practices in instruction. The school will serve as a hub to gather and memorialize best practices from across the district, state, and nation.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Training and coaching for K-3 teachers on the Science of Reading so that all students, regardless of economic status, have access to excellent instruction in every classroom, and can read by the end of 3rd grade. The Moonshot School will be the place to see best practices and propagate the system with highly effective teachers, improving education in Indian River County and beyond.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

All books and materials comply with current DOE guidelines. Services for all K-3 students include additional reading instruction during the school day, after school, and summer for struggling readers, embedded coaching to ensure excellent instruction, parent voice and choice through a participatory engagement model, and effective, engaging delivery of robust curricula to improve student outcomes.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Educators and grade school students will be served by this project. We expect to serve over 3,000 individuals.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The Science of Reading tells us that proficient students require proficient teaching in both the code and language comprehension. So we will be measuring student growth but also SDIRC has pioneered a way to measure and grow high-quality teaching across 6 domains through our coaching model. Walk-through data will be collected, calibrated and compared across time, grade levels and schools. Teacher proficiency and growth will be measured and monitored using the SDIRC's Instructional Excellence walk-through tool which is anchored in standards based instruction and the Science of Reading. Student growth and proficiency will be measured and monitored using multiple means of assessing, including F.A.S.T., DIBELS, Sonday, iReady, and Amplify curricula assessments.
