a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?



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The funds will support the Human Rights Education and Advocacy Initiative to educate individuals on the importance of human rights and individual freedoms. The project will achieve this through workshops in schools, community centers, and sporting events, training educators and community leaders, and distributing educational materials. Outreach campaigns will raise awareness, address oppressive ideologies, and empower citizens to advocate for and protect fundamental rights.
