13. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

Bigs in Blue is an interactive based mentoring program offered by Big Brothers Big Sisters Association of Florida (BBBSAF), facilitated by its local member agencies, that connects youth with first responders in communities, building strong, trusting, lasting relationships. Through high quality, professionally supported mentoring, young people have a greater opportunity to grow up to be confident, competent, caring adults. These relationships build strong bonds between first responders and the families we serve.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

BBBSAF will manage and provide programmatic and financial oversight to the BBBS local agencies (subcontractors). Local agencies will make and support new and existing mentoring matches between youth and first responders. Matches will receive a range of services: recruitment, assessment, training, matching, monthly mentoring, and match support from a trained BBBS professional.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Mentoring activities will focus on educational support/academic enhancement, career exploration, experiential learning, and/or developing skills and abilities that will lead to improved potential, confidence & self-sufficiency. Youth will be mentored for a minimum of once per month. Sessions will be held in the community, at schools, at first responder workplaces, at BBBS partnering organizations, or virtually.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The Bigs in Blue program serves youth who are at-risk of poor academic performance, behavioral issues, family dysfunction, and other situations that may lead to negative future outcomes. Mentors are active and/or retired first responders (i.e., law enforcement, EMT, Fire/Rescue, State Attorneys, etc.).

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Matches meet monthly for site or community-based mentoring sessions with mentors who are first responders to engage in academic enrichment activities and community engagement, such as outings to museums, parks, recreational events. Additionally, matches will spend time job shadowing/career exploration at law enforcement entities. The benefits are that youth will: gain extra support necessary to improve and excel in their academic career; learn about law enforcement or other first responder careers in their community. Those experiences can lead to a more positive & fulfilling future. The Youth Outcome Survey is a BBBS assessment tool used to evaluate a youth's change in skills and behaviors, such as perception of academic performance, social acceptance, competence & risk avoidance, due to participating in BBBS mentoring. Number of mentor sessions and hours are monitored, tracked by BBBS local agency professional staff.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for in the contract?

Financial consequences will be assessed at 3% of the reimbursement value submitted for each month during which the deliverable is not met.
