13. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

Achievers for Life (AFL) dropout initiative has been in Duval County since 2007, serving more than 8,723 students. AFL takes a unique approach to serving students, starting in middle school, through mentoring, family support, case management and academic enrichment to increase the graduation rate Duval County Public Schools. The specific goal of this funding request is to fund direct service hires for nine Achievement Advocates across the ten DCPS middle schools served by AFL.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?



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The program is supported by Achievement Advocates (AAs) who make a multi-year commitment to the program. In addition to their work with students and school personnel, advocates work with the student's families to identify each student's strengths and address obstacles that prevent the student from succeeding in school. Parent engagement is a crucial component to the success of the child.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Advocates provide case management services to families and students helping them to increase their stability and focus on school. By providing the wrap around services, from tutoring to connecting parents with self-sufficiency services, students will be engaged and successful graduates of DCPS, leading to a more successful life.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

More than 800 Economically disadvantaged persons, At-risk youth, and Grade school students are expected to be served.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The project is expected to improve mental health, AFL aims to increase family engagement activities, to help parents become partners to the school and to their child's education, and to reduce any non-academic barriers to student success, by allowing students to focus on being students. To measure this AFL will continue to track and monitor student success indicators, student improvement, and parent involvement in engagement activities to quantify the program's impact. The project is expected to improve the quality of education. The purpose of AFL is to assist Duval County Public Schools to increase the graduation rate which was 57% for AA students and 66% of all students in the fall of 2007 and now stands at 85% for AA students and 91% for all students today. This funding request will continue and improve upon these statistics. To measure success, AFL will continue to monitor and track student graduation rates, family engagement, student GPA, student proficiency in Math and Language.
