a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

The funds will support the construction of the academic facility to complement the new Honors Residence Hall and complete the planned Honors Living and Learning community. Integrated living and learning facilities promote student success by increasing retention, degree progress, professional development, and career readiness.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Classrooms, offices, labs, study, and meeting spaces, including space for Honors signature programs with partners like Blackstone Launchpad, MedNexus, and ArtsUNF, lab support for Al and innovation projects, meeting rooms for student groups and university and community partners (e.g. Honors Student Union and Career Services), and multi-media, mixed-use conference rooms and maker spaces.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Students will have access to essential classroom, study, program, and event space and updated systems to enhance learning and student success at UNF. The facility will provide direct services to Honors students, UNF students and programs, and Honors community partners, focusing on students' professional development and recruitment for the workforce.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The facility serves several target populations, specifically the 900+ Hicks Honors College students; second, numerous UNF students, faculty, and staff who participate in Honors affiliated programs; and third, community partners, including employers, non-profit organizations, and citizens who participate annually in Honors sponsored events and signature programs.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Improvements in student academic and career services for these students will have a direct and quantifiable impact on measures such as academic progress rate and career success. These measures are already key accountability measures by which UNF is evaluated by the Board of Governors. We report them at least annually through our Accountability Plan, and they are part of the Performance Funding Metrics by which all of the SUS is measured.

This contract will be subject to a GMP. As such, any cost overruns and/or delays will be the responsibility of the contractor(s) and outlined in the contract. We have had success with this model on previous projects.
