a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

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With a mission to promote AI education, workforce development, and industry collaboration in Florida, AI-LEAD will prepare industry professionals, educators, and students for a rapidly evolving technological world. The funds will establish Jacksonville University's AI-LEAD initiative to address workforce shortages in AI, cybersecurity, autonomous systems, and 3D manufacturing. The goal is to upskill workers, train students and educators, and develop career pathways to meet Florida's advanced technology needs.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Activities include corporate training, AI education for students and educators, 3D manufacturing programs, cybersecurity training, and partnerships with local industries. Services include creating a "Learning Factory" for engineering, enhancing the CyberRange and Digital Forensics Lab, and offering certifications and career pathways.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Citizens will access advanced training in AI, cybersecurity, and manufacturing, career development programs, certifications, and educational resources. The project will also engage local industries, K-12 schools, and other high education partners to provide hands-on learning opportunities and practical applications of technology.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The target population includes students, educators, incumbent workers, and industry professionals. Over five years, 1,000 individuals will receive AI training, 500 will be trained in cybersecurity, and 100 graduates or certified workers will be leveraging AI and autonomous systems in Cyber Industries or Advanced Manufacturing.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The project will create a skilled workforce in advanced technologies, strengthen local industry partnerships, and enhance regional competitiveness. It aims to close the skills gap, improve job readiness, and foster innovation in Florida's technology sectors. Outcomes will be measured by the number of individuals trained, certifications awarded, new industry collaborations, job placements in technology sectors, and the success of engineering graduates in autonomous systems and advanced manufacturing.
