13. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

Funds will directly support services to citizens by providing high school students with an opportunity to enhance learning and academic achievement through innovative educational methods. Faculty assigned to the charter school will have professional opportunities to teach both high school and college-level courses, fostering academic growth and success among motivated students.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The charter school will combine high school courses with college-level instruction using innovative methods. Instructors will have flexibility to tailor teaching to ensure student success. The benefit will be measured by student performance in both high school and college courses, reflecting the effectiveness of the approach. Graduates will earn a high school diploma, college credits, or an Associate Degree, enhancing employability in technical and professional fields. They will be prepared to enter the workforce or pursue advanced degrees, increasing long-term economic opportunities and career potential.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Funding will provide parents and students with alternative educational options. Students will have access to both required high school courses for graduation and college-level courses toward earning an associate degree. Additionally, teachers will benefit from enhanced professional development opportunities to support their role in delivering high-quality education at both levels.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The target population to be served by this project include the following: university/college students, high school students, economically disadvantaged person, at-risk youth, and teachers seeking professional development opportunities to teach at both levels, enhancing their skills. We anticipate the individuals to be served between 201-400.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The charter school will foster a culture of optimism, perseverance, and innovation among students, faculty, and staff. It will emphasize positive learning experiences and constructive feedback to encourage growth. Students will be empowered to take on leadership roles and have a voice in shaping their education, enriching their cultural experience by promoting engagement and responsibility. The level of benefit will be measured through full-time student enrollment and academic success, reflecting the positive culture of the charter school. Encouraging learning experiences and giving students a voice will drive success. Ongoing assessments, including observations, surveys, and feedback, will track progress and identify areas for improvement, ensuring continuous growth.

A consideration such as withholding a portion of allocated funds until specific deliverables or performance measures are met are suggested.
