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13. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

Funds will support completion of infrastructure hardening of the building. The primary hazards facing PBC include natural disasters (i.e., hurricanes/tropical storms), extreme weather events (i.e., drought, floods, fires), communicable disease, technological hazards and human-caused hazards (PBC Div. of Emergency Management). About 94% of the county's population resides within 12 miles of the Atlantic coast, making hurricanes a primary emergency concern. This project will protect the safety of clients and team members on campus, while creating a hardened food distribution hub capable of serving meals to 500 people per day in an emergency.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Hardening will be completed by summer 2026 concurrent with ongoing renovation activities. Funds will be used to complete the interior of the building including lighting, flooring, security, and fire safety. Upon completion the space will provide shelter with the capacity to produce meals for about 500 local community members per day. The Cafe is managed and operated by Arc team members who train and oversee workers with disabilities. Trainees currently provide meals to 90 adults with disabilities each day, providing food security to a vulnerable population.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The Arc of Palm Beach County operates 7 group homes across Palm Beach County, serving over 50 residents with disabilities. Further, The Arc has capital funding to construct an on-site hurricane/storm shelter for 70 local clients and families. This project allows us to ensure food security during an emergency for our residents as well as other community members.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The south campus and cafe serves adults with intellectual and developmental disabilities and their families. Hardening will enhance safety and security for 200 clients and team members who frequent the campus each day, while creating a community resource for emergency food distribution. The Cafe currently provides employment training for 20 adults per year through the program.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Direct outcomes include improving the agency's infrastructure through hardening and providing access to local food in the event of an emergency. Construction will meet hurricane codes and will result in the capacity to maintain a food distribution hub. Secondary outcomes include up to 50 adults with disabilities per year receiving vocational training in hospitality and service industry.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for in the contract?
