Necessary infrastructure includes a self-docking floating dry dock capable of handling vessels up to 10,000 LT weight and project will serve as catalyst to a myriad of additional business and industry for Gulf County and the region. This proposal also enables Port St Joe, Gulf County, and the region to become a vessel outfitting and vessel repair center for the northern Gulf of Mexico competing with the likes of Tampa, Mobile, New Orleans and related vessel outfitting and repair locations.
