13. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

Program research indicates that gun violence in Tallahassee-Leon County occurs most frequently in four zip codes and within four distinct neighborhoods. Socioeconomic disadvantage, racial/ethnic homogeneity, residential instability (i.e., turnover), and divorce rates were the neighborhood characteristics associated with increases in gun violence. Intervention in the lives of those most at-risk of becoming involved in gun violence through the provision of positive support services will reduce the recurrence of their involvement with the criminal justice system and the potential escalation of violence behaviors. A notable reduction in the occurrence of gun violence in Tallahassee-Leon County will result.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

CSMB navigators serve as case workers who use law enforcement intelligence tools to identify persons at greatest risk of becoming involved in gun violence, conducting outreach to these persons, screening them for service needs using clinically validated tools, connecting clients with community service providers, and providing a stable, trusted, mentoring relationship with the client. This involvement is designed to meet needs, identify and address trauma, and divert at-risk persons away from gun violence.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

CSMB navigators serve as case workers who use law enforcement intelligence tools to identify persons at greatest risk of becoming involved in gun violence, conducting outreach the these persons, screening them for service needs using clinically validated tools, connecting clients with community service providers, and providing a stable, trusted, mentoring relationship with the client.

Reduce the occurrence of gun violence among the target populations, thereby saving lives. Year over year comparison of the number of gun violence incidents occurring in Tallahassee-Leon County, and longitudinal tracking of individual client involvement with the criminal jsutice system will be the performance metrics applied.
