### 13. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?



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This project will replace a facility that was set up in1987 as a temporary site and presents the following challenges today:

- Mobile Home is 37 years old
- Mobile Home is not a secure facility due to the structure of the building and the age
- · Mold and Mildew in the building due to the inability to circulate air
- Building is not hurricane resistance and will not sustain massive winds.
- Agency will outgrow the size of the building as new employees are hired
- The building does not provide an efficient and secure evidence storage room that is required by FDLE with a high emphasis on security.
- The building does not have secure windows or doors that are required for a secure law enforcement agency

### b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Public safety buildings are critical infrastructure, serving law enforcement, the public, and detainees while ensuring controlled access, high-security zones, and threat mitigation. Strategic planning enhances efficiency, command & control, and force protection, reinforcing resilient infrastructure and public trust through secure zones and containment areas.

### c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Midway has the largest, most strategic I-10 interchange in Gadsden County, linking US 90 and I-10. With truck stops, hotels, restaurants, and a major commercial park, it is a high-traffic hub. Ensuring a safe, secure environment for travelers, businesses, and residents is critical to regional safety and economic stability.

### d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Well-designed police facilities enable staff to perform their duties efficiently, effectively, and securely. As the facility ages, it may no longer meet the needs of an evolving department, thus, negatively affecting morale, efficiency, safety, security, technology, and overall delivery of police services. When these conditions occur, agencies search for alternatives, typical remedies include expanding or renovating the existing facility, or building an entirely new facility. Most smaller departments have limited resources. Having a stable and secure police department will provide the ability for meeting the community's policing needs. The police station design is no longer just about building a secure, operational building. More than ever before, integration and relationship building with the community is a significant component of effective law enforcement.

### e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

- The building will provide sufficient office space for sworn and non-sworn employees
- The building will provide secure areas for police equipment inventory
- The building will provide an efficient kitchen with a break room for staff
- The building will provide a health and fitness room to help actively prepare the officers physically and mentally to remain vigilant while they protect and serve.
