The City of Gretna Fire Rescue Department (GFRD) seeks funds for the purchase of a fire engine pumper. The GFRD currently holds an ISO rating of -10. The department's primary fire engine, a 1990 E-One, is 35 years old—well beyond the NFPA 1900 & 1901 standards, which recommend a 15-year service life for front-line apparatus. To improve emergency response capabilities and reduce the city's ISO rating, the GFRD has been actively pursuing funding to acquire essential apparatus and equipment. This new truck will play a crucial role in achieving that goal, enhancing both efficiency and community safety.

Its advanced design ensures improved efficiency and reliability in critical emergency situations. As the first-line engine/pumper, it will play a vital role in responding to emergencies, improving overall response times, and ensuring safety.
