13. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

The funds will support The Boselli Foundation's Mentorship programming and operations to increase the number of justice-involved youth who receive mentoring services and trauma-informed programming both while serving their length of stay and as they transition back into the community. The program equips mentors to utilize skill building, peer to peer interactions, and story work in a safe environment to increase the self-awareness and coping skills of young men.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?



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The Boselli Foundation Mentorship Program is a leadership development program designed to encourage young men to become functional leaders through empowerment and mentorship. By utilizing story work, skill building, and peer to peer interactions in safe settings, young men in the Jacksonville community receive support and guidance to become functional leaders in their communities.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Young men (ages 13-22) will receive leadership skills training through trauma-informed mentorship both during and after their length of stay in jails or detention centers to support their growth, development, and success post release.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The project will serve around 200-400 economically disadvantaged persons, at-risk youth, and currently or formerly incarcerated persons

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The expected benefit of the project is improving mental health, the program has produced positive results in the following areas: understanding personal style of communication, confidence due to self-worth and personal value, healthy expression of needs, identifying patterns of behavior due to childhood experiences and trauma, leadership abilities, and recognition of what a healthy relationship looks like. To measure this, Pre and Post surveys are completed by program participants. The project is also expected to divert individuals from the criminal and Juvenile Justice System. Recidivism rates of program participants are decreased 30-90 post release, and success will be measured through transition specialists' documentation and arrest records.
