Martin County is facing significant challenges related to housing affordability and availability. The last housing study specific to our county was conducted over 15 years ago. Since then, we have relied on data from neighboring counties such as St. Lucie and Palm Beach, which do not fully reflect the unique circumstances and needs of Martin County residents.

Members of our local workforce in the moderate to low household income levels and retired seniors. The goal of the study is to learn the number of units that we need available in our county for the number of households/individuals in our workforce at targeted household income levels for those households/individuals physically working in our county and our retirees. When this housing is created/made possible low-to-moderate households will become self-sufficient again.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Local wage earners and retired seniors that physically work in Martin County will regain housing stability. Homelessness will be decreased.

Local businesses, including our essential services organizations will again be able to recruit and retain top talent. Our local economy will improve. The physical and mental health of our county will improve. Families and seniors will thrive again. This will be measured by the decrease in the number of seniors and wage earners experiencing homelessness for the first time in their lives. Organizations assisting members of our workforce and our seniors will report a decline in the need for housing and shelter. Businesses will report less turnover. Traffic in and out of our county will decrease. Policies will be created based on facts, these will in turn support a healthier community and an overall healthier and thriving economy.
