4. Project/Program Description

Florida Atlantic University will continue addressing the national and state healthcare workforce shortage and changing needs in healthcare by continuing to expand its medical student enrollment class size, adding AI competency to the curriculum and expanding residency and fellowship programs. In the past two years, the university has expanded its class size by 25% and has plans to continue increasing enrollment and residency programming with continued funding. We will also hire new faculty with a focus on emerging areas of AI, data science and precision medicine to support the continued expansion.

13. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

FAU will address workforce shortages and changing needs in healthcare by significantly increasing the medical student enrollment class size and adding AI competency to our curriculum, expanding residency and fellowship programs which reduce unnecessary hospital admissions and readmission and enhancing medical/graduate curricula to promote new core compentetncies. FAU will continue to develop FAU Medicine as a model for data-driven care, emphasizing mobile, pre- and post-hospital medicine.



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b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

FAU will deliver health care services through its clinics and FAU Mobile Health. Through predictive analytics, we will be able to determine which care can be administered safely outside of hospitals and meet patients where they are. Expanded enrollment and fellowships will allow for more doctors training in local hospitals, clinics and doctor's offices throughout FAU's service area. Additional faculty will expand the university's ability to train more medical students and therefore graduate more doctors.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

In addition to increased doctors, residents and medical students serving the community around FAU, the university will also increase subspecialty trained physicians through its expansion of residency programs and fellowships. Each fellowship program will graduate 1-3 fellows per year. FAU's Mobile Medicine will also provide individuals with direct medical services via a mobile unit.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

More than 3.2 million residents currently live in Broward, Palm Beach, and Martin counties, and these individuals are all within the target population that will be served by this project, in addition to individuals living in Indian River and St. Lucie counties.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will

be measured?

Florida Atlantic University will continue its expansion of the medical school enrollment to meet the needs of a rapidly expanding & aging population of Florida and healthcare workforce shortages. These students will not only aid in resolving workforce needs in the state, but will be educated with this new curriculum to provide data driven efficient healthcare in our communities. FAU will utilize enrollment, graduation, and residency data to measure outcomes and impact on healthcare in Florida.
