a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

Increase the number of students attending NWFSC/UWF at the Fort Walton Beach campus majoring in areas of engineering and technology. Increase the number of students entering the local workforce in the engineering and technology industries.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?



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The services provided will be 4-year degree programs in areas of engineering and technology relevant to the needs of the local industry. Activities included will be student advising, student success initiatives, industry-led advisory board, capstone projects (with industry), certifications, internships, and apprenticeships.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The direct service will be the offering of 4-year degree programs in areas of engineering and technology. The local workforce will also see an increase in available graduates for hire.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The target population lies within Fort Walton Beach and east to Panama City. Currently 200 students are enrolled at the Fort Walton campus. Under the re-brand, the goal for total number of students served is 600. Individuals working within local industry will also be able to hire talent directly from the graduate pool.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The expected benefit is a home-grown talent pipeline for local industry in the Fort Walton Beach area. The methodology to measure outcomes are 4-year graduation rate and number of students working in the local industry.
