13. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

This will allow a jump start of a Veterans' Treatment Court in Santa Rosa County, enabling the First Judicial Circuit to have an additional year lead time to budget and secure long-term permanent funding for this much-needed court. We have a rapidly increasing population and the high number of veterans and retired military in our area, many of which have pre-existing conditions such as PTSD and Traumatic Brain Injuries (TBI), that can predispose them to behaviors prompting run-ins with law enforcement.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The VTC Coordinator will provide case management for each participant. A VTC coordinator will work hand in hand with the Veteran as well as VA mental health counselors and addiction personnel if substance abuse is involved. Individual and group sessions, day treatment, medication evaluation and management, in-patient treatment and hyperbaric medicine and weekly drug testing, and community control monitoring GPS setup/admin fee are included.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The Veterans Treatment Court will assist in reducing individuals incarcerated at the county jail and diverting offenders from the state prison system which will provide a cost savings at the local and state level. A contractor will coordinate treatment services for 30 participants which include assessments-psychosocial/biopsychosocial/substance use, individual treatment sessions, drug and laboratory testing. All of this will be coordinated for the Veterans and shared with the stakeholders.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Veterans who are drug offenders in the criminal justice system and those Veterans who have crossed with the law, depending on the severity of the crime.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Improved physical health with cessation of any substance abuse. ¿Improved mental health equals reduction of depression, anxiety, learning new techniques to deal with PTSD, triggers and suicidal ideation. Methods: Drug and laboratory testing, individual treatment sessions, outpatient group sessions, mental health counseling sessions, day treatment, medication evaluation & management, in-patient treatment if needed. Mental health counselors will gauge improvement. Reduction in suicides.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for in the contract?

The First Judicial Circuit has been managing Veterans' Treatment Courts in Okaloosa and Escambia counties for years and is will correctly administer this funding, if approved. It has managed the Santa Rosa County VTC for one year. This appropriation will allow sufficient lead time for the First Judicial Circuit to obtain funding to continue to administer a Veterans Treatment Court in Santa Rosa County over the long term. Any problems with testing subcontractor failure will result in termination of the contract and reissue with a functioning contractor.
