4. Project/Program Description

West Florida Historic Preservation, Inc.'s mission is to become the forefront leader in history, arts and culture in Northwest Florida. We do this by managing 30 state owned historic properties in Escambia and Santa Rosa Counties. Many of these properties are museums which include a 34 acre archeological site, historic farmstead, general history museum, a fine arts museum, a children's museum, a multicultural center, an archives and research center, and a historic village with living history programs. These resources serve as a cultural heritage tourism engine attracting over 212,000 visitors and 15,000 schoolchildren annually. Locally we receive support from both Escambia County and the City of Pensacola, however our state owned heritage tourism sites are in need of additional funding support for maintenance and preservation in addition to general operations.

13. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

The funds will be used for continued maintenance and operation of the 30 state owned historic properties that the organization manages in Escambia and Santa Rosa Counties. Many of these properties are museums and include a general history museum, a fine arts museum, a children's museum, a multicultural center, an archives and research center, and a historic village with living history programs. These resources serve as a cultural heritage tourism engine attracting over 200,000 visitors annually.



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b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Among our myriad programs, we offer self-guided art and history exhibits, guided house museum tours, living history programs, and special programs like our ever-popular Ghost Tours and our Art Academy for Autism. Our school programs are among the best in the State and we draw over 15,000 schoolchildren to Historic Pensacola Village from across Northwest Florida and South Alabama.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The project will deliver STEAM-focused educational programming in the form of school field trips for grades K-12, adhering to Florida's Next Generation Sunshine State Standards; public programming includes lectures, tours, seasonal programs, and hands-on interactive activities for children; and continued maintenance and preservation of a popular and significant community historical resources.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Our Museums and Archaeological sites are multi generational resources that provide education and outdoor recreation to both local citizens (K-12 school age, young adults, middle-age, and senior community) and out-of-town visitors. We host over 200,000 visitors annually from over 28 states with a breakdown of roughly 42% local citizens from the tri-county area and 58% out of town guests. Annually we host over 15,000 schoolchildren.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The project will increase visitation to the historic sites. Visitor counts will be taken to track visitor numbers and compare to current numbers.
