b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Repair, restore, and preserve the historic Grand Army of the Republic Hall in Zephyrhills, FL. This nearly 115 year old building has served as a central hub for veterans and the residents of Zephyrhills, with the Historical Preservation Board



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Restoration of building, repair of water damage to ceiling, HVAC system upgrade and maintenance, restoration of flooring, replacement of stairs, other needed updates to historic building.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The GAR Hall houses American Legion Post 118, offering community and services for veterans. Additionally, the GAR Hall currently hosts ROTC programs as well as Boys and Girls State programs. Repairs and renovations to the building will allow for hosting increased programs for veterans and youth, including Scouting troops, Civil Air Patrol, etc.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Since construction in 1912, the GAR Hall has housed veterans organizations. Originally the building housed the Grand Army of the Republic, an organization for Union veterans of the Civil War. Since 1938 the GAR Hall has housed American Legion Post 118. The mission is to offer community to veterans while fostering and perpetuating Americanism. Additionally, the American Legion supports youth programs such as the ROTC and Boys and Girls State, providing benefits to the entire community through such programs.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

By repairing, restoring, and preserving the GAR Hall, the American Legion Post 118 will be able to continuing supporting veterans and the larger Zephyrhills community by offering the many programs supported by the American Legion.
