13. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

The Tallahassee Law Enforcement Childcare Center is a strategic solution to the law enforcement recruiting and retention crisis, directly addressing the childcare challenges that force many officers to leave the profession. By providing reliable, flexible care, officers can work overtime, respond to callouts, extend shifts, and attend court when needed. This initiative will enhance career advancement, attract top recruits, and improve retention—especially for single-parent officers—ensuring a stable, committed police force.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The Tallahassee Law Enforcement Childcare Center will provide customized childcare and early childhood education specifically designed to support law enforcement families. Services will include extended hours to accommodate overtime, callouts, and unpredictable schedules, affordable tuition through public-private partnerships, and high-quality education programs to ensure children meet developmental milestones while officers focus on their duties.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The appropriation project will provide critical childcare services that enable law enforcement officers to effectively serve and protect citizens. Without peace officers, there is no peace—their presence is essential for public safety, crime prevention, and emergency response. By ensuring officers have reliable, flexible childcare, they can remain fully staffed, focused, and ready to uphold their duty to protect the community. This will reduce crime, improve response times, and strengthen community trust, creating a safer environment where businesses can thrive, attracting investment, boosting economic development, and fostering long-term prosperity.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

This project serves law enforcement families by providing high-quality childcare and educational programs tailored to their unique needs. The primary target population includes children ages 0-5 years for early childhood education and care, as well as school-aged children through after-school and summer programs. By accommodating the demanding schedules of officers, the center ensures that their children receive consistent, structured, and nurturing care while they focus on protecting the community. The program is expected to serve approximately 53 families per day, based on an average of 1.5 children per family, ensuring that officers have the support they need to remain in their careers and continue safeguarding public safety.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The Tallahassee Law Enforcement Childcare Center will reduce officer stress, improve retention, and enhance public safety by providing customized childcare. 85% of parents will report reduced stress (measured by the Parenting Stress Index), and 90% of children will maintain or improve developmental skills. The program will increase recruitment, reduce turnover costs, and strengthen economic growth. Success will be tracked through stress surveys, retention data, and crime trends, proving the impact of childcare on law enforcement stability and public safety.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for in the contract?

The agency may require quarterly progress reports and impose financial penalties for failure to achieve key metrics, such as officer retention rates, childcare enrollment targets, and measurable public safety improvements. Additional oversight measures, such as third-party audits and performance evaluations, may also be implemented to ensure compliance and accountability. Suggested penalties may include funding reductions, contract termination, or performance-based reimbursements if deliverables are not met.
