	Through the Center for Translational Research in Neurodegenerative Disease (CTRND) and the 1Florida Alzheimer's Disease Research Center (1FLADRC), the University of Florida (UF) has established a high-impact program of scientific discovery aimed at translating basic discoveries into therapies that benefit patients. Our major focus is on Alzheimer's and Parkinson's disease but includes related neurodegenerative diseases (other forms of dementia, ALS). These State funds have in the past, and will continue, to support the development of major programmatic initiatives at UF and within the state Our mission is to discover, develop and evaluate novel treatments and diagnostics for degenerative brain diseases including Alzheimer's disease, Parkinson's disease, and stroke. This research will help to change the current understanding of these diseases from being inevitable, incurable, and largely untreatable to a new reality in which these diseases are preventable, curable, and treatable.

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

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These funds support our Alzheimer's and related disease research, including development of immunotherapies targeting the Tau protein. State funds provide an ability to support costs beyond the federal grants that now total over \$40M/yr. They help us to recruit new faculty, hire staff, study participants, build needed infrastructure, provide training, develop innovations, and support activities required by these grants.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

These State funds have in the past, and will continue, to support the development of major programmatic research initiatives related to Alzheimer's and other Dementia and Parkinson's disease and other movement disorders at the 1FL ADRC and UF CTRND and within the state. They provide necessary support for the 1Florida ADRC (https://www.nia.nih.gov/health/alzheimers-disease-research-centers), which is a collaboration between Florida institutions that includes the University of Florida (UF), Mt. Sinai Medical Center in Miami Beach (MSMC), University of Miami (UM), Florida International University (FIU) and Florida Atlantic University (FAU). The 1Florida ADRC's global mission is to work with other ADRCs and stakeholders in the AD field to help change the understanding of AD and AD related dementias (AD+ADRD) to a new reality in which they are more facilely and accurately diagnosed, more effectively treated and ultimately preventable or curable.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Participation in Alzheimer's and Parkinson's Disease Research Studies, Clinical Trials for new Alzheimer's and Parkinson's Therapies. Training of next generation physicians and scientists. Lay education regarding these disorders.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

University/college students (~250), elderly persons (>25,000), persons with poor mental health (>25,000).

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Increasing research portfolio in dementia and Parkinson's disease, increased clinical trial access, progress towards new therapies, new interventions, professional and lay education regarding neurodegenerative disease coping, treatment and research. We track publications, patents issued, technology licensed, and extramural grant awards from publicly available databases.
