Students complete application and interview process to be considered for the scholarship.

Scholarship funds in the amount of One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000) to each eligible student.

High school students or graduates, who reside in the City of Miami Gardens.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The expected outcome is 75-100 students matriculate to college/university, graduate with their 2-year or 4-year degree, and gain professional employment. Surveys will be conduced to track student progress during and after their collegiate careers. Surveys will also monitor overall debt throughout each collegiate year.

If scholarships are not awarded to a minimum of 75 qualified residents, remaining funding will be refunded to the appropriating state agency.
