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The funds for this combined EOS project will be used to renovate an existing facility (MSL) on the USF St. Petersburg campus that was substantially impacted by the hurricanes to ensure its long-term useful life & to construct a new storm-hardened EOS Research & Teaching Facility in an updated location further inland to safeguard the state's investment in both of those facilities. This project is designed to be phased with efforts to most efficiently meet university and community needs.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The combined funds from all sources will pay for construction to renovate the MSL facility as well as the construction of a new facility and/or new building addition further inland to include teaching laboratories and research laboratories and associated fixtures, furnishings and equipment on the USF St. Petersburg campus.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

This facility will house individuals conducting nationally renowned research in flood mitigation, resiliency and environmental and oceanographic sciences. High-achieving, cross-disciplinary USF students will be obtaining their degree in Marine Science and STEM undergraduate/grad programs offered at the facility.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

University students, Counties, municipalities, and citizens of Florida affected by coastal and inland flooding. >800

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Improve quality of education - Expand undergraduate and graduate programs in marine and environmental sciences and other high-demand STEM areas at USF/Increased students graduating with high-demand undergraduate and/or graduate degrees to fill critical workforce needs. Enhance/preserve/improve environmental or fish and wildlife quality - Expand nationally renowned research in flood mitigation, resiliency and, environmental and oceanographic sciences/Increased research in critical areas for the state including examining the environmental impacts of hurricanes, as well as assist the state better prepare for future storms.
